Built: 1838. Current Owner: Diageo. Production Capacity: 5,00,000 litres. House style: Appropriately malty, spicy and faintly perfumed. Glen Ord is situated south of Inverness at Muir of Ord, (which means moor next to the hill). The distillery is now under the ownership of Diageo having been incorporated into the DCL group in 1925. The distillery was founded in 1838, although it is widely believed that distilling took place on this site long before this time. In 1961 the floor maltings were converted into a Saladin Box malting (similar to the one still in operation at Tamdhu)

and this supplied the malt for the distillery until they were decommissioned in 1984. The mechanical maltings that had been built at Muir of Ord in 1964 to supply the group's other distilleries, then took on the role. Older bottlings of Glen Ord are sometimes bottled as 'Glenordie', 'Ordie' or 'Ord'.

Nose: Buttered toast, lemon curd and croissant, with hints of peppery oak.

Palate: Apple blossom, white flowers and more pastries alongside toasty oak.

Finish: Dried apricot and green oak.

Glen Elgin Distillery is located on the A941 between Elgin and Rothes and was built in 1898 by a partnership of William Simpson & James Carle. Production at Glen Elgin did not start at the distillery until May 1st 1900. The famous architect Charles Doig predicted that Glen Elgin would be the last distillery built in Speyside for 50 years. This is a bold statement, but he was right. The next distillery to be built was Tormore, in 1958. Glen Elgin is not widely known for its single malts but is a key component in the White Horse blend. The distillery has seven stills, four wash stills and three spirit stills. The stills are not very big and only produce around 1,800,000 litres a year. House Style: Honey and tangerines.

Nose: Oatcakes with orange marmalade, sweet cereal with wafts of ginger and fresh leather.

Palate: Clementine peels and chocolate digestive biscuits give way to peppery oak with a touch of burnt sugar.

Finish: Sweet honey, lingering malt and warming oak spice.

Built: 1878. Current Owner: Berry Bros and Rudd.
Production Capacity: 5,600,000 litres. House style: Sweet, and often a complex experience with spice, fruit and perfume.

The casks they select, carefully chosen from 2% of the distilleries annual output, are mostly matured in sherry casks with 25% being fresh, and a few bourbon casks occasionally used to provide balance and extra depth. Independent bottlings of Glenrothes are also frequently found, with some impressive examples to be enjoyed.

Color: Dark natural colour


Nose: Powerfully sweet, dried figs, spiced cakes, chocolate frosting

Pronounced: Pult-nay. Built:1826. Current Owner: Inver House Distillers Limited. Production Capacity: 1,000,000 litres House style: A gorgeously soft, fruity easy-drinking whisky, with a possible salty tang. One of Royal Mile Whiskies' best selling malts, Old Pulteney is an under-rated whisky. The Distillery was built in 1826 in the town of Wick (or Pulteneytown), close to John o' Groats in the far North of Scotland. It has been in the hands of Inver House Distillers since 1995 who have produced the current single malt.

Clynelish distillery is near the town of Brora in the Scottish Highlands. It was built in 1967 to replace the old Clynelish distillery that is now called the Brora distillery. The original distillery was built in 1819 by the 1st Duke of Sutherland. The Duke was the wealthiest man in the United Kingdom at the time and was one of the most

controversial people in Scottish history. The new distillery was built just across the road from the old distillery. Being three times larger than before, Clynelish created an exact replica of the stills that were in the old distillery to make sure the spirit was as close as possible to the spirit produced before. Clynelish is currently owned by Diageo. Clynelish has three wash stills and three spirit stills that produce around 4,500,000 litres a year. House Style: Seaweed, spicy.

Nose: Chocolate rice pudding, ginger cake and honeyed malt.

Palate: Waxy, floral honey, with cinnamon porridge, vanilla buttercream and freshly baked sourdough.

Finish: Fruit and nut milk chocolate alongside spiced cookies.

Caol Ila Distillery (pronounced cool-EEla) means “Sound of Islay”. It gets this name from it’s location of where the distillery sits, looking out on the Sound of Jura the stretch of water that separates Islay and Jura. Caol Ila was founded in 1846 by Hector Henderson. Caol Ila was mothballed in 1927 and reopened in 1937. The distillery was closed one more time during WWII. In 1972 all the buildings except for the warehouses were demolished and rebuilt. They built a larger distillery but it was built to the

same original style as before. Caol Ila is currently owned by Diageo. The distillery is the 2nd largest distillery in the Diageo portfolio and is by far the largest distillery on Islay. House Style: Oily, olive-like, juniper.

Nose: Sea shells, brown sugar, and oatcakes with a smidge of apricot chutney.

Palate: Savoury notes continue on the palate with salt and pepper crisps, seaweed, and butter. A hint of caramel and green apple in the background.

Finish: Spent matches and salted lemon.
